Adult leaders are considered trained once complete with **Youth Protection Training** **and** the required courses listed below.

Once trained, adult leaders may wear the official *Trained* emblem on the left sleeve.

Required Training:

ALL LEADERS

Youth Protection Training is required for all registered adults. Must be retaken at least every 2 years.

BOY SCOUT LEADERS

- **SMs and ASMs**
 1. Scoutmaster Position-Specific Training
 2. Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills (IOLS)
- **Committee Members:** Troop Committee Challenge

VENTURING LEADERS

Advisors & Committees (VLST) and Youth (VLSC)
Venture Leader-Specific Training

CUB SCOUT LEADERS

Specific training for every Cub Scouting role is offered. If a change in leadership position occurs, the leader must take the training for the new position to continue to wear the strip.

- **Tiger, Wolf, Bear & Webelos Den Leaders:**
Den Leader Position-Specific Training
(2015 Syllabus covers all 5 levels in one class)
- **Cubmaster and Assistant Cubmaster:** Cubmaster Position-Specific Training
- **Pack Committee:**
Pack Committee Position-Specific Training
also called Pack Committee Challenge
- **Pack Trainer:** as Committee above & Fundamentals of Training
